Description: A triangular shaped, lidded box with rounded corners. The base is brass

and is decorated with enamel flowers predominantly in blue. The lid is also brass with the center bearing a carved onyx slab. The edge of the lid

is decorated with enamel flowers and butterflies, with blue as the dominant colour. The box has the word "China" on the bottom.

Description: A rectangular wooden, possibly ebony, lidded box with lobed corners.

The fitted lid is decorated with an intricately carved and pierced jade

centrepiece. The jade centrepiece is loose.

Material: stone, serpentine; wood, teak

Dimensions: 13.0 x 9.5 x 15.0 cm

Description: An urn-shaped serpentine bowl with heavy dragon-shaped handles

(serpentine is a mottled green or yellow hydrous magnesium silicate, used as scurce of asbestos and as architecturally decorative stonework). The teak lid is bell-shaped and features intricately carved openwork. There is slight wear on inside bottom of bowl, and the top is slightly

damaged.

floral design decoupaged on outside. The egg splits in half to reveal an

empty cavity. The paper trim needs re-glueing.

Description: A cylindrical brown-coloured metal box with a slightly domed lid which is

blue-coloured with a brass-coloured edge and small handle. Three small

short feet support the bottom of the box. The outside of the box is

decorated with red and gold vertical stripes and loops that alternate with stripes and dots of inlaid abalone shell. The lid has looped design made

up of a series of small dots.

Description: Oblong rectangular lidded box with wood base and copper lid. Box base

lightweight wood and remnant of Canada One Cent stamp stuck on bottom. Lid decoration has circle symmetrically decorated with pierced

scrolling. Lid separated from rim by copper corrosion.

Description: A lathe-turned round-dish, flat-bottomed box with a domed, lapping lid

which fits flushly over a flange on the box body. Box and lid are painted a boxcar red and decorated with designs of circles and flowers, varnish over paint has oxidized. Interior of box has been painted a dark green.
