History /

Biographical:

Samuel Livingston (1831-1897) was born in Ireland, and immigrated to North America as a young man to participate in the California Gold Rush of 1849. Sam continued travelling and panning for gold around the northwestern United States and southern British Columbia area in the 1850s and 1860s. After marrying Jane Howse in 1865, Sam settled near Elbow River and established a buffalo skin trading business. Sam and Jane had 14 children together, including 8 sons and 6 daughters.

In 1876, Sam and his family moved closer to Fort Calgary, where he worked with John Glenn and became one of the first farmers in the area. Sam was a founding director of the Calgary District Agricultural Society in 1884, as well as founding director of the Calgary branch of the Canadian North-West Territories Stock Association in 1886. Sam was also an early trustee for the Glenmore School in 1888.

Scope & Content:

File consists of one miniature monthly calendar distributed by Wendell MacLean Chemist and Druggist, Calgary. Calendar is attached to a poster with a lithographed colour image of prospector, trader and farmer Sam Livingston.

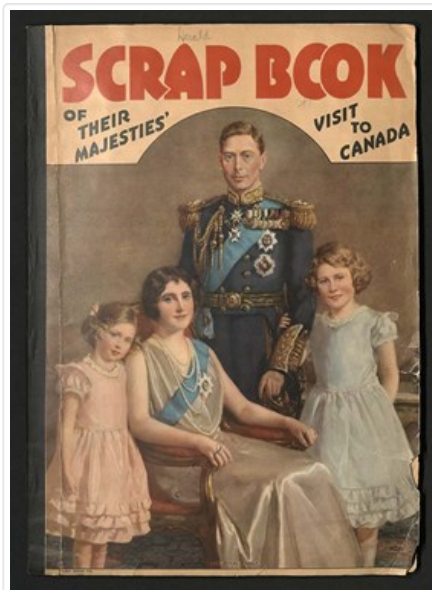

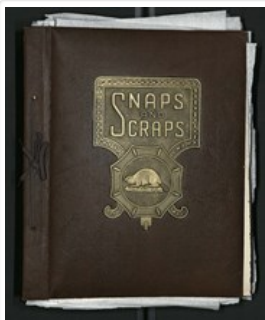

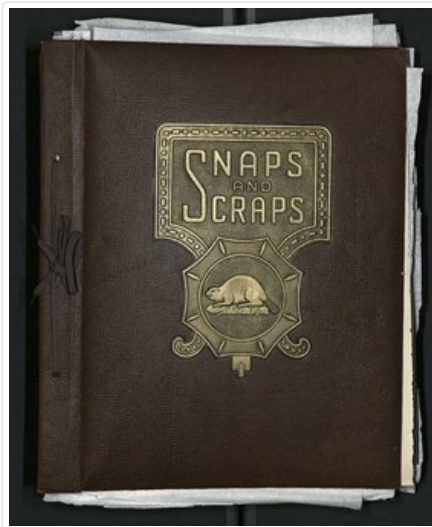

Dr. George Francis Gillman Stanley born in Calgary, July 6, 1907 met Ruth Hill in Ottawa; George Stanley spent his childhood summers in Banff; George Stanley's father was in wholesale paper business

George Stanley describes Eleanor Luxton as part of the "snooty group"; summer visitors and residents didn't mix; George Stanley attended the University of Alberta at the same time as Eleanor Luxton; George Stanley in the Honours History program; George Stanley met Eleanor Luxton at University of Alberta functions; the Luxton name was well known

First impressions of Banff; World War I; Prisoner of War camp at the Cave and Basin
George Stanley History major; first degree from University of Alberta; Oxford, Rhodes Scholar; summer school in France; Doctorate at Oxford; spent 6 years at Oxford awarded various scholarships and earning four degrees

Lack of employment on return to Canada; University in remote province (New Brunswick)
Army experience; militia before WWII; George Stanley was assistant to Colonel Stacey; overseas in Historical Section, Canadian Army;

George Stanley became friendly with Eleanor Luxton at Western history conferences following University

George Stanley given freedom to roam around Banff by himself as a child; after his marriage he started house hunting in Banff for his retirement; 1955 George Stanley's mother died
George Stanley's visits to Eleanor Luxton in Banff; often stayed with her

George Stanley had a strong interest in Western Canadian history; his father was a strong influence; member of local historical society in Calgary

George Stanley helped Eleanor Luxton with finishing of the Tillicum book

Discussion about Banff manuscript

George Stanley saw a lot of the Annie manuscript, a biography of Eleanor Luxton's grandmother, Annie McKenzie McDougall

Eleanor Luxton supplied Stanley's with western history books

Ruth Stanley went out to dinner most times with Eleanor Luxton; Mount Royal Hotel; climbing stairs to Le Beaujolais restaurant (Bertello's at the time)

Eleanor Luxton's possessions; cloisonné bought in China in 1930s

Incident with Ossie Treutler; Indian trade silver; pin to Ruth

Coin dealer in Moncton; greatest treasure a set of uncirculated Canadian quarters; wrote cheque for \$ 1,000.00 for them

Buffalo Nations/Luxton Museum opening

General de Chastelaine; protégé of George Stanley at Royal Military College Kingston;

George Stanley was on staff of RMC for about 20 years

Visit to Sackville; PEI

Stanley children; Dela, Mariette, Lori

Eleanor Luxton a night hawk; her gift giving was very generous and thoughtful
