15.5x23.2, behind glass.Inscription reads "Musket Balls lost by David

Thompson at Athabaska (sic) Pass on January 13th, 1811, and

discovered by The Interprovincial Boundary Survey July 1921. Presented by R.W. Cautley The Leader of the Survey Party. Note In frame Musket was originally spelled Muske1 and then a bar put through to make it look

like a t.
