RACES START TEN A.M.

FIRST RACE:

TEN MILE FREIGHT TEAM RACE. Load: 100 pounds net weight per dog

SECOND RACE:

FIVE MILE SPEED RACE. Any number of dogs per team and any type harness and sleigh.

THIRD RACE:

JUNIOR ONE HALF MILE DASH. Open to boys and girls not over sixteen years of age. Any number dogs and any type of harness and sleigh. No entrance fee.

FOURTH RACE:

ONE MILE SPEED RACE, Free for all. Any number of dogs.

Any type harness and sleigh.

FIFTH RACE:

ONE MILE SINGLE DOG RACE. Free for all.

SIXTH RACE:

ONE MILE SPEED RACE. Free for all. Any number of dogs and any type harness and sleigh.

- 8 A. M. ONE HUNDRED MILE CHAMPIONSHIP DOG GRAND PRIX for the "STRONGHEART" Trophy, donated by STRONGHEART, the Wonder Dog of the Movies; and \$2500 in Cash Prizes, donated by Laurence Trimble, President Trimble-Murfin Productions. Open to the World. Under BANFF DOG RACING CODE.
- GRAND PRIZE - \$1000 in cash and one leg on the "STRONGHEART" Trophy. Note - The "STRONGHEART" Trophy will be awarded to an owner whose team wins three times at Banff. The Trophy shall remain in possession of the Banff Dog Racing Association until it is won outright. An engraved record of each leg won will be placed on the pedestal.

SECOND PRIZE, \$750 in cash.

THIRD PRIZE, \$500 in cash.

FOURTH PRIZE, \$250 in cash.

BANFF DOG RACING CODE

In the interest of good sportmanship, an appreciation of the historic and gallant part played by the Sleigh Dog in the development of the great North-West, and with a desire to further perpetuate and develop the Sleigh Dog the Banff Winter Sports' Association have formulated and adopted the following rules to be known as

"THE BANFF DOG RACING CODE."

- 1. Races to be open to the world.
- A nominal entry fee of \$1.00 to be paid by all entrants before starting in each race.
 - The course of each race shall be arranged annually by the committee.
 - 4. The races shall be known as "The Banff Dog Races."
- Teams in races of ten miles or more shall be of any number of dogs, sleigh and harness to be of any style. Special rules governing shorter races may be adopted at any time.
 - 6. Drivers shall not be changed during the race.
- 7. Each team shall finish the race with the same dogs, and no others, with which they started the race.
- No dog shall be allowed to enter any race until a competent official has decided that the animal is in a fit physical condition for the contest.
- A racing card will be presented to each driver, with his name and a description of the dogs in his team printed thereon, which must be handed to the judges at the conclusion of the race.
- 10. No driver shall attempt to take the lead of any other team on the trail until the rear of his sleigh has cleared by a distance of at least ten feet the lead dog of the team he is attempting to pass.
- Cruelty or any harsh treatment of dogs shall subject the driver to disqualification from any and all races.
- 12. The driver of each team will be supplied with a number, for identification purposes, which must be displayed conspicuously by him at all times during a race.
- 13. No driver shall interfere, annoy or molest any opposing team or driver in any way whatever. Violation of this rule will subject the driver to disqualification.
 - All complaints must be made to the judges.
 - Judges shall have absolute charge and control of the races.
 - There shall be no appeal from the decision of the judges.
- 17. All races shall be held on the day and hour set, regardless of weather conditions, and shall not be postponed unless by a decision of two-thirds of the executive committee of the Association in favor of such postponement.
- 18. The team covering the course in the best time will be declared the winner, the team covering the course in the second best time will be declared second, and so forth; the result to be decided by the time the lead dog crosses the finishing line.
- 19. The presentation of trophies, cups and prizes will be made to the owners of the winning teams, through the drivers.
