Celebrating Rotary's Twentieth Birthday



FIRST founded in February, 1905, Rotary has another birthday this month. Twenty years ago Rotary comprised a small group of men meeting together frequently in Chicago. That small group increased in size. As it increased physically the "idea" grew mentally. Fellowships deepened to friendships. Soon a member carried the idea to the Pacific coast; another planted the seed of Rotary across the boundary into Winnipeg; another organized a similar group on the Atlantic coast; then to the old world—to the Orient—until today in more than eighteen hundred Rotary Clubs in twenty-eight countries men of the ancient mysterious East clasp hands with their brothers of the newer Western world. Literally, not figuratively, for if the reader could but stand on a magic carpet and look upon a great composite picture of the hundreds of Rotary meetings taking place most any week-day on which he happens to be reading this, he would witness that very thing.

With no reference to religious or political creed, but with a firm purpose conceived of Rotary, men the world over are consecrating themselves in those age-old principles for which Rotary is sounding a new voice to the end that humanity may achieve understanding, good will and international peace through a *world fellowship of business and professional men* united in the Rotary ideal of service.
