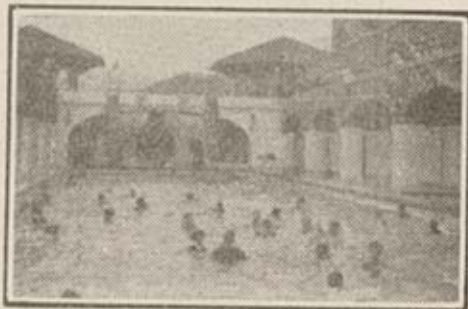

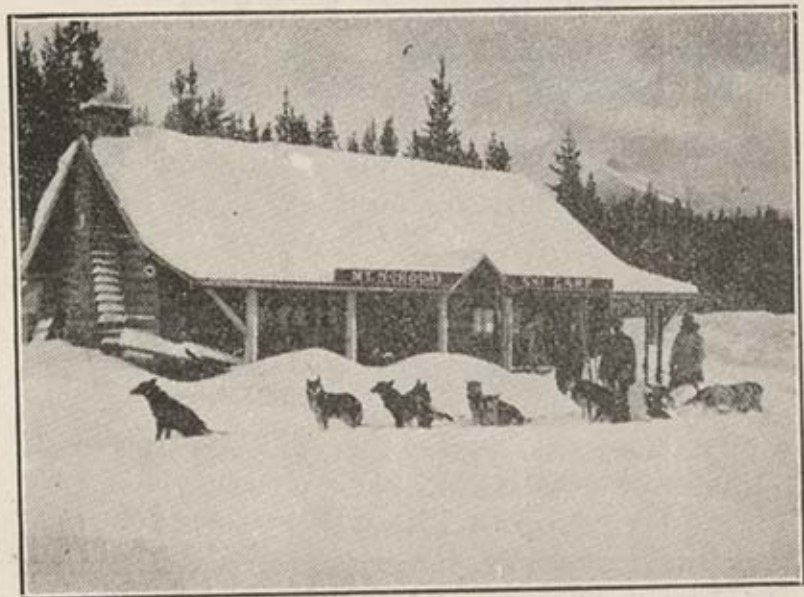

**N**ESTLING in the pass between Stony Squaw and Mount Norquay is situated the Ski Camp bearing the name of the latter mountain. Here every day during the Carnival the visitor will find a hearty welcome, as arrangements have been made with the Ski Club to throw open its doors to all those who wish to pay a visit to this wonderful mountain ski resort. The Club House faces Mount Norquay, on the slopes of which the novice and those more experienced will find conditions to his liking. This year the Club has cut out a run from the cliffs near the summit of Norquay. On this run the skier drops approximately 1700 vertical feet in three-quarters of a mile. The experienced skiers of Banff will give exhibitions on this run during Sunday afternoon, as well as other feats of daring on the slopes including slalom racing, cross jumping, galendesprung, long distance jumping, etc. The afternoon will be devoted to ski sports.

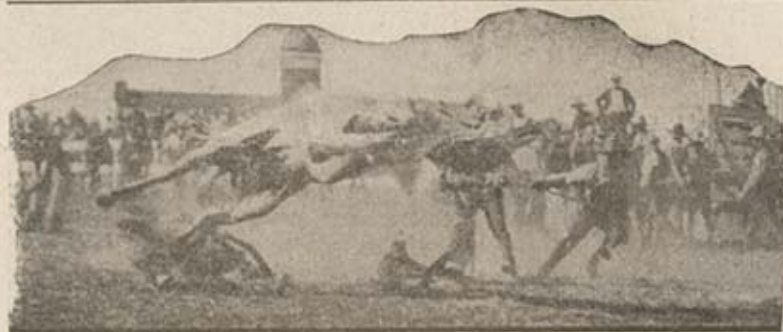
