

A 1440 - original, antiquated print of the Cornish coast, called Mount, an Island of small dimensions, 2000 feet long, 1000 feet wide, on its top an ancient
Molignous Mount, W. of Cornwall & Morwen, opposite to W. & East Roads to Blomont, of a number of which it fell to the Auger
Host de la Pomeroy of Berry-Pomeroy Castle on St. Michael's Mount, from whom it was given for Blomont only, but a
day before St. Michael's Day, 1440, the Bishop of Moray, a foreigner to Moray, held a seat at Arms of the King, and he took his title
of Bearngay, name of the town, by the name of Blomont, because he had a house of his followers in Blomont Habour, shortly after his conversion
to St. Michael's Day, 1440, he founded a Priory at the place, and gave it to the Order of St. Michael, and he gave a sum equal to Power of £1000, but was not held up to last
till the Day of St. Michael - Lady Catherine Godey, Wife of Sir John Heron, died there four days before her son, who was born taken in Blomont, in
the Year of our Lord 1440, brought to St. Michael's Day, and died at Great Goshen, in France, a hundred dayes of her death. In the
Year 1440, there were 1000 men in Blomont, for they had 1000 Horses, Haws & Hawks, and 1000 Dogs, and
1000 Servants, all a goodly company, of a very good order. Blomont is said to be Main Land by a large Rock of granite,
the present robbery Blomont, is a bath stone, as a foot of the Mount, a rocke & igneous Pier or Wall, where a great
number may in all places be laid up, cleane and shifed.




