



Party packing horses when I go back to camp - Bill Cameron & Thompson walked on ahead as far as Keweenaw Ch - where waited for pack train - afternoon rode and helped drive horses - Camped for night at big meadow below Amiskwachuk Ph. poor camp ground but fine feed for horses.

Day very fine but toward evening clouded over and looked like a storm - Left feed at 9:20 (train) and arrived at meadow just after 6 pm.

July

WEDNESDAY 3

1918

Moray broke free and began
had some trouble with Thomas
who said he was going back
to Field - Eventually he
decided to stay - Cameron the
butcher

went ahead with Cameron
& Thompson. Light snow
at mouth of Amiskewi
Pass. Cleared off and
dry because fine &
bright. Got down by
lull & across across Boulder
Ch. M. Reached old
camp ground on the Blackfry
soon after 5 pm - pack
train came along shortly
after - Good camp ground
put my tent in same
old spot - comfortable
bed - -

Below mouth of Amiskewi Pass
on N. side two great snow
slides have blocked valley had to
work around them.

July

THURSDAY 4

1918

Break fast at 7 am - packed up my tent & stuff and with Compton pushed up Blackberry. Crossed Wildcat Creek on a log and went up trail to 1st crossing of Blackberry River - waited there for packtrain. Kept with them very saddle horse to cross the river. Boys all in a good temper - when half a mile from the Horse Pass Meadow stopped suddenly because jam caused by snow slide. Had to take horses up steep hill-side to west and walk through the brush until we came out at the end of the meadow - here was old camp ground - and got comfortably settled in - dinner about 4.45 pm. Fine bright, warm day. Put my tent in the old place. Thomas all night worked well today.

July 5 Vailong FRIDAY 5 AM Loan 1918

Spent day in camp getting things in shape and ready for our fly camp tomorrow. Posted account - put things out to air - oiled my boots etc.

After lunch Thomas & Hobart left with ten horses for the Blueberry Camp on way to get supplies cached at cabin.

Spent afternoon mending - sorting out stuff for Fly camp - etc. Began Muleteer's letter after supper finished Muleteer's letter - posted diary and loaded 24 holders for Fly camp.

Day very warm & sunny - day over - afternoon clouded over and felt like rain cleared again at night & got cooler - Mosquitos very troublesome all day.

July

SATURDAY 6

1918

Breakfast at 6. am. Packed up fly camp to tongue of Conway Glacier and left about 8.30 am. Tom Martin came with his saddle horses & a pack horse for one pack to mouth of Canyon of Horse Creek. From that point we packed on to base of cliffs at foot of ice fall. Had to double back through brush to flat above canyon. After our lunch we packed up the cliffs to timber line and made camp in a little point of brush. Dry camp but walking a long way down in ravine.

Day very fine and hot. Got up cliffs pretty well but new land's food is difficult with packer. Campbell & I had time. Men boys fly. Mosquitos very troublesome.

July

SUNDAY 7

1918

201 bush - on Freshfield
got out with help

Called toys at 5. am
Had breakfast and got away
by 7. am. Left Cameron in
Camp to go and get grub

Thompson had good supper ready for us - Day very late feeling hot Sun very hot & bright - and got still more body burned - Felt pretty good for three such hard days - Mosquitos very troublesome - Turned in early - Felt pretty good at living get through so successfully

July

TUESDAY 9

1918

Called Camp at 6. am.
Had breakfast and packed
up. Started for main camp
about 9. am.

Got safely down cliffs with
our packs.

Had plenty of grub although
we did not have extra grub
back.

Packed everything on down

boat across creek from

After a while at 70 am started out to cross snowfield but when had gone a little way clouds rolled over it enveloping us and traveling on it became too dangerous so turned back. Heavy rain soon gave us a good welly. Continued back to camp through rain and when we got in and pieled, we found Tom had got back to camp before the rain and gave us tea with our lunches. Rained during afternoon. Cloudy and cold. Fell on the ice on the way home and had to sing back.

September

SUNDAY 1

1918

Breakfast at 7 am.

Clouds down low although day looked like a fine one -

My back pretty sore - Did nothing during morning - all feet much disengaged - at our bad luck

Day turned out fine and bright and clouds lifted - So had lunch at 11.30 am. and after went up on high point of Moraine between two glaciers - no trouble getting there from the ice.

Took 8 views which showed very spectaculars of the ice fields, nice & warm - and enjoyed the station, although my back troubled me quite a bit -

Thomas & Charlie went back to camp - Charlie returned after supper with more supplies.

September

MONDAY 2

1918

Breakfast at 5. am - up before daylight. Day looked grand not a cloud in the sky.

Left day at 6. am. and made place where mts. were cached at 8:10 am. Body of clouds rolled up Glaciar Lake Valley and Bright Ch. Valley gave us a scare but they dissipated. Took a 2½ hour to cross snowfield. Slow work as the new snow made travel among the ~~De~~ dangerous. Reached White pass peak - the highest point at 10:45 am. Started to slide while climbing required care and was slow. Reached summit of Singph. (mt. Victoria) at about 12:30 pm. Very fine station and quite good for work. Took two photos. Slid down a road of Cynthia - built single track. Left at 4:15 pm. Had to hurry to get home before dark. Took a low road half for slide and crossed snowfield in much

September

TUESDAY 3

1918

Breakfast at 7. am.

Packed up and moved with
men - Camp arrived there at
1.30 p.m.

Glorious day - Slender like
Fairland - On hill near
Camp one horse rolled back
and had to unpack him to get
him up - no damage done.
Soon got tents up and spent
afternoon resting and talking,

All ok. at man camp
I have had wood cut for
all the tents.

Back since very sore. Turned
in early -

No clouds - bright sunshine

WEDNESDAY 4

Campbell, Thompson & Cameron went up to a station on Sarbach. I decided it would be advisable to give my back a chance -

Glorious day - not a cloud in the sky - Rested and did a lot of Chorus.

The boys got back at 7.30 pm. They made the summit ridge of Sarbach and got a good station. Quite warm all day on top.

Got all in readiness to move for Thompson Pass tomorrow

September

THURSDAY 5

1918

Breakfast at 6. am.

Packed very slow - did not get away until 10.30 am.
Had no trouble crossing the North Fork or Horse River.

Lost a lot of time though retying packs. - At 5.30 pm. Camped ^{near} at an old Indian Camp where there were a lot of sheep traps & bones. Stopped about 6 miles from Valley of the Arkansas River.

Slept in open - did not put up big tent.

Glowed right - a haze of glass - Great Holes all around.

September

FRIDAY 6

1918

Bread for sat. 6 am.
Glorious day. Very quiet.
Slept splendidly in the open.

Rose at 6 before breakfast.
Got away at 9.30 am.
Bitter, hilly. Made
about 15 miles and camped
near the bend of Alexandra
River. Camped at a
few minutes to 4 pm.

Glorious day - bright sunshine
all day on gravel bar and
dry flats of River Valley -
crossing and recrossing - channels
flooded.

SATURDAY 7
