we left about 11 at 4 we were hoping for

The weather was not kind here on the whole I remember more rain than seen — a burst let water bottle on a wet night. here we became so sorry did get worried over the food trayant had found out part of our intended stores had fore to find camp met a cheerful notice board marking a spot where a party had here snowed in in July! Edie seemed to have missed a trail left us to camp I went ahead & find a Rayons cabin — Range out —

went on again evidently the night was 2. seemed satisfactory a damp
36 on squibeg

pt. field camp we tried to make it
last flows gone - started in June
weather then it poured last
ride on grey pony.
saw smoke - lunch in camp
