

Pages from the Past

Thirty Years Ago

(from the Crag of August 24/1945.) Mr. T. E. Chester of Winnipeg, assistant general manager of the Canadian Pacific Railway Hotels, spent some time in Banff and Lake Louise inspecting the Banff Springs Hotel here and the Chateau at Lake Louise, which have been closed for several years. He was unable to state when these two hotels would re-open.

(from the Crag of August 21, 1915.) ...J.B. Harkin...and James Brewster...made a trip over the Simpson summit towards Lake Louise and Paradise Valley last week. The object of the trip was to explore a scenic trail connecting Lake Louise and Banff.

Climbing accidents

A Sunshine Village employee and two Calgary men were rescued by the parks mountain rescue service Sunday in separate accidents in the Valley of the Ten Peaks.

Del Muzillo, 21, was hit on the head by a rock in an ice couloir between the third and fourth peaks.

He lost a crampon, and was thrown a rope after another party heard him calling for help.

He suffered frozen knees and cuts and abrasions to the head. Unable to walk out because his legs were so stiff. he was flown to Moraine Lake by Parks helicopter.

A warden checking the Cooper Hut for the two Calgary climbers, who failed to report in Friday, found Mr. Muzillo.

Jerry Rogan, about 32, and Jim Elzinga, 21, were rescued about 7:30 p.m. Sunday after spending two unscheduled nights on Delta Form Mountain. They suffered from cold and exposure.

Chief Warden Andy Anderson said they might have died if they hadn't both been well equipped and experienced. They had sleeping bags and enough food with them but no tent.

Low cloud cover and heavy rain Saturday prevented their rescue when they were spotted by the helicopter after a three hour search.

Waking to a whiteout

Sunday morning, the two feared rescue would be impossible before Monday, so they tried to get off the mountain themselves.

They climbed about 400 feet over a ridge on the 11,002-foot peak and walked for seven hours Sunday. Wardens in the helicopter saw their tracks in the snow and cloud cover lifted enough for them to be taken out by helicopter sling.

Both men were extremely weak and the hands of one were white with cold.

They had attempted a variation of an extremely difficult route, rated as five plus. Fifteen wardens co-ordinated in the rescue operation.

We always preach that weather in the mountains changes very quickly," Chief Warden Anderson said.







Timberline Tales by Jim Deegan and John Porter is the first publication of the Peter Whyte Foundation. The book consists principally of the humourous verse of the two authors, but there are selections that are poignant and serious.

The publication came about because of the generosity of two anonymous benefactors. They had seen the poems in the Archives' collection and asked a member of the Peter Whyte Foundation's Board of Directors if it would be possible to have the material published. They were willing to donate the necessary funds, and the Board agreed to the project.

R.J. "Bob" Hope, who was raised in the Banff-Lake Louise region, was contacted to illustrate the book. Over the winter the editorial work was finished and the book was designed. Since it's now in the final stages of printing and binding, we're sure copies will be available in time for *Back to Banff* Day, and have arranged for the authors and illustrator to be here for the occasion.

Many of the characters and incidents celebrated in *Timberline Trails* will be familiar to our readers. Ike Mills, Bill Peyto, Bill Neish and Ray Legace are featured in several tales, as are the authors themselves in escapades that they'll not youch to the truth of.

Copies of *Timberline Tales* will be available at the Peter Whyte Foundation at a cost of \$2.95, or by mail for \$3.25. Several of the illustrations will be displayed and on sale on *Back to Banff* Day as well (not all of them: Bob gave an illustration to each of the authors).

It's a rumbustious collection of verse, and we're sure that readers of *The Cairn* will share in the spirit of good fun that Jim Deegan and John Porter have had in Banff and the mountains.

Peter Whyte Gallery

Prior to his residency in Banff, Maurice Jones worked in an executive position for the Y.M.C.A. and as a commercial artist for various graphic art firms. Finding his creativity stifled by the rigid demands of the advertising world, he sought more adventurous terrain. As an active mountaineer and woodsman for many years, he began to find interesting and unusual points-of-view from which to do his paintings. Once amid the serenity of the mountains he records his observations with great precision and awareness, producing a watercolour that is exacting in shape and colour. Maurice Jones's watercolours will be on display in the Gallery from May 19th until June 15th.

An intermittent resident of Banff for six years, Pat Askren is a full-time fine art student at the Alberta College of Art. Represented locally at the Arts and Crafts Fair last summer and the 1975 Stonecrop Pre-Christmas Sale in Canmore, Pat's work may be described as genteel, quaint and accomplished. She employs pencil and watercolour to originate whimsical portraits of beds. Delightfully delicate, her beds and quilts are too enticing to avoid viewing and too alluring to deny fantasy. Pat Askren's show Quilts will be on display in the Swiss Guides' Room from August 22nd until September 7th.

To coincide with Banff Indian Days, the Banff Festival of the Arts and the Indian Ecumenical Conference, the Peter Whyte Gallery will present a multi-media exhibition by Wilma Simon, an Ojibwa from the Sarnia Reservation.

Following a three year study of fine art at Fanshawe College in London, Ontario, Wilma attended the Banff Centre during the 1972 summer session. On completing it she was accepted at the University of Montana to study fine art and native education. In 1975 she went on to Harvard University, acquiring her M.A. in 1976.
