Dear Lillian:

The Canadian Rockies in July and August combine everything that is lovely and desirable - alluring trails winding into the heart of the mountains, forests of spruce and pine, meadows of vivid flowers, lakes and rivers, rugged peaks, warm sparkling days, cold mountain nights, crackling camp fires, snug eiderdown beds, comfortable tents and the open stars! It seems early to be planning for July, but I will be in Guatemala thru March and so must think ahead, for I am organizing a group of from six to fifteen young people, girls and boys, for a July pack trip in the Rockies and a smaller group of adults, both men and women for a similar trip in August. I would love to have you or any of your family with me and so want to tell you of my plans.

The July group will leave New York June 29 and reach Devona, a small station on the Canadian National Railway east of Jasper, July 2. Here guides, cook and wranglers will be waiting with saddle and pack horses, and in short order the cavalcade will be on the march thru open country above the Snake Indian River to our first night's camp some miles down stream. For four weeks we will ride and camp thru the mountains having many "lay-over" days in which to explore the country on foot and horseback. There will be good fishing, mountains to climb, flowers to study, frequent glimpses of wild game - deer, moose, caribou, sheep, goats, bear - and subjects for color photography everywhere. On July 29, after several days at the foot of Mt. Robson, the highest and most beautiful peak in the Canadian Rockies, we will ride down the Valley of a Thousand Falls to Robson station and board the train for the East.

The August group will leave New York July 26 and reach Robson station on July 29. Here I will meet them and we will ride up to Robson Pass, skirting Berg Lake with the Tumbling Glacier dropping a straight mile into it from Robson's summit, to camp among the big spruces opposite the Robson Glacier and the snow fields of the Robson Cirque. In this lovely spot we linger several days then start northward, with views of Mt. Resplendent and the Coleman Glacier, swing past Twin Tree Lake, traverse high country where few people have been and which rangers say is the most beautiful in Jasper Park, cross a series of passes, none of which are marked on the map, have days of alpland travel and make camp in scenic spots to enjoy "lay-overs" for scrambling, climbing, fishing and loafing. On August 25 our trail leads us back to Jasper in time to board the afternoon train for the East. If one has leisure and inclination, the two trips may be combined into one with little retracing of steps - and what a health and strength giving vacation that will be! Also one may linger indefinitely at the charming and luxurious Jasper Park Lodge.

The price per person for either trip, including everything from arrival in the Rockies until departure from them, is \$350. Travel expenses out and back, including ticket, Pullman berth, meals and tips is approximately \$170.

Several people are already interested in both trips, so if you care to consider either one will you write me as soon as possible to 33 Tulip Street, where your letter will receive prompt attention while I am away?

Dear Lillian:

I was glad to get your note of January 25th and to know that your mother was better and that you both were resting up quietly for a time. It was a terrible strain that you both went thru and I know just how hard it is, and yet how blank and empty everything seems after it is all over. Time along can soften that feeling of loss and loneliness, but fortunately time does soften, or else else we could never go on.

I hope you can come over here for a Sunday walk and perhaps movies on Saturday night, with Marguerite, the Fullers and the Watermans, soon after I get back from Guatemala.

I am so delighted that Mrs. Valentine has decided to take the whole trip with me. As her final telegram came to me from Merion, I have an idea you and your mother may have persuaded to take the five weeks off. I believe it will do her lots of good and it will be lovely to have her. Big Marion Gale is going and Hal Learned and Mr. Edward H. Dodd of Dodd, Mead and Company and I think we have a very nice party. I believe Val and Hal will get along well together.

I led an Appy walk out here yesterday and was quite pleased to have nine people step off the train from New York. Pammy went too and so there were eleven of us and the day was absolutely perfect and we had a lovely time.

I am sending this letter out now, instead of my usual folders, for next summer's trips? How do you like it and them? It is possible that I may send some one in charge of the July trip and myself go back to Guatemala again with a small group, sailing June 26th, returning July 23rd and leaving for the West on July 26th. However that is all in the future.

I am contemplating this next trip to Guatemala with the greatest of pleasure. We are due to set sail next Monday - one week from today.

I had a long letter from Aida Boyce the other day from Cut Bank, Montana where she is visiting a brother and sister-in-law on a farm and she says she is so busy there that she is almost happy. She apparently did not know about your father.

Ever so much love to you and your mother and I hope to see you early in April.
