# Horseback and Camping Trip in the Canadian Rockies

July 17 — September 2

1922

We (a small private party) will leave New York on July 17 and travel across Canada via Montreal, Winnipeg and Edmonton, to the little mountain village of Jasper, Alberta, in the main range of the Rocky Mountains, about 200 miles north of Lake Louise. Here our guides, saddle horses and pack-train will meet us, and on July 21 our little cavalcade will start upon the trail.

The first night will be spent some miles from Jasper, probably on the banks of the Maligne River, and then for 38 days we will ride and camp through the mountains, pitching our tents at night beside lake or stream, and riding by day through one of the loveliest sections of the Canadian Rockies. We will cross the beautiful Southesk Pass, well above timber line, where our path will be a veritable garden of wild flowers, descend into the valley of the Brazeau River, journey to the headwaters of the Saskatchewan River, and eventually on August 29, return to Jasper via the little visited Tonquin Valley with its emerald lakes and snow clad mountains.

Trout and game abound in this lovely wild country. In especially luring spots we will make two or three day stops and take side trips for fishing, climbing or riding.

The days we travel we will average 5 or 6 hours in the saddle and cover between 15 and 20 miles. Our route will be over trails entirely—there are no roads—and we will ford the streams when we come to them. We will sleep in tepees or in the open, as we prefer, and eat our meals, prepared by a camp cook over an open fire, on the ground under a fly. Our equipment will be carried on pack horses and experienced guides will do all the work of the camp.

The price for the entire trip from New York to New York, including everything except purely personal equipment, such as clothes and sleeping bag, will be \$800. Of this \$100 should be paid upon registration and the balance not later than July 1.

Miss Hinman In Her Trail Clothes

Miss Hinman is arranging to take a small private party on an eight week riding and camping trip in the Canadian Rockies.

The party will leave New York on July 10, spend the following morning in Toronto, journey for two nights and a day across Lake Huron and Lake Superior in a luxuriously appointed steamer of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, cross the Canadian prairies via Winnipeg, Moose Jaw and Calgary, and on July 15 arrive at Banff, in the heart of the Canadian Rockies.

Here two days will be spent, probably as guests of the Alpine Club of Canada, in its attractive clubhouse on the slopes of Sulphur Mountain.

On July 18 the little band will start upon the trail, each person on a reliable saddle horse, with experienced guides to do all the work of the camp and a string of picturesque pack horses to carry tents, bedding, personal duffel, cooking utensils and food.

The first day's ride will be short and camp will be made on the banks of Healy Creek, where the camp cook will have preceded the outfit and have ready a hot supper, cooked over an open fire, to be eaten on the ground under a "fly."

For forty days the party will ride and camp through the mountains, making camp at night beside lake or stream, and riding by day through forest and valley or over high mountain pass, where moose or caribou or shy mountain sheep may be seen.

The trail will lead to the foot of lofty Mount Assiniboine, rightly called the Matterhorn of America, past the Kananaskis Lakes with their guardian mountains of snow and ice, into the Kootenay Valley, carpeted with brilliantly colored wild flowers, through the Brisco Range to the Valley of the Upper Columbia River, northward to the Ottertail Range, to Lake McArthur and beautiful Lake O'Hara, and finally end, on August 27, at Lake Louise. Here, before returning to Toronto and New York, four days will be spent in the well known and beautiful chateau on the shore of the lake.

The trail trip will require approximately twenty-five days of travel. The remaining fifteen days will be scattered throughout the trip and spent in especially beautiful camps, where the desire to settle down to tramp, fish, climb or merely revel in the beauty of the scene, can be least resisted.

A day's travel usually means five or six hours in the saddle and covers a distance of fifteen to twenty miles. The route will be over trails entirely and at night the balsam beds will be laid in tents or in the open, as each camper prefers.

The price for the entire trip from New York to New York, including everything except purely personal equipment, such as wearing apparel and sleeping bag, will be \$800.
