Pack Trips and a Canoe Trip in the Canadian Rockies

July, August and September 1931

Seventeenth camping trip in the Canadian Rockies

CAROLINE HINMAN

In the summer of 1931 Miss Hinman will again direct and accompany a July pack trip, an August pack trip and a September motor canoe trip in the Canadian Rockies. The trips may be taken separately or together for each section covers different and equally alluring country.

The July party will leave New York on June 26, reach Banff on the morning of June 30 and, after luncheon in the Banff Springs Hotel, ride out the lovely Sundance Trail to the first camp in the mountains of the Bourgeau Range. Here beside a mountain stream with a background of spruce covered hills the "outfit" will be waiting—guides, cook, pack horses, tents, tepees, cooking and eating utensils, folding tables, stools and literally a ton of food to appease healthy mountain appetites. Next day the trail will lead south to Mt. Assiniboine, the so-called "Matterhorn of America," over miles of open alpine country with snowy mountains and emerald lakes on every side, along the Sky-line Trail of the Continental Divide to the region of Wolverine Pass, Tumbling and Washmawapta glaciers, McArthur Pass and the Lake O'Hara Valley. On July 27 the party will divide—those who must leave going in to Lake Louise Hotel for luncheon and taking the East-bound train that afternoon, and those who are staying on for August riding to the beautiful Ptarmigan Valley to await the August party from New York which will reach Lake Louise the morning of July 28, have luncheon at the Hotel and join the campers in Ptarmigan Valley that afternoon.

For four weeks the August party will ride and camp thru the lovely mountain country between the Cascade River on the south and the Red Deer on the north where the clear sparkling streams abound in fish and the sunny, grassy slopes harbor timid mountain sheep. On August 24 the party will reach Banff, have luncheon in the Banff Springs Hotel and then, those who must, leave for the East that afternoon. Those who can stay on will spend a week in the attractive Canadian Alpine Clubhouse in Banff, then go north by train to Jasper Park where on September 1 they will meet the September party from New York

All will spend a day at the Jasper Lodge with motor trips to Maligne Canyon and Mt. Edith Cavell and on September 2 take the train westward to Prince George, motor thirty miles to Summit Lake from where all streams drain into the Arctic and there meet the guide, cook, tents and provisions for the thirty day motor canoe trip. This trip is full of variety and interest—Hudson Bay trading posts, Indian villages, gold prospectors' camps, lonely rangers' cabins, fur traders in 40' freight canoes, a twenty mile canyon where the Peace River cuts thru the Rocky Mountains from British Columbia into Alberta and around which the party travels by portage, great rolling prairies dotted with homesteaders' cabins, brilliant autumn foliage, streams and lakes full of gamey trout and enough hunting to keep the camp in fresh meat and fowl—a trip full of romance and adventure combined with easy down stream travel and every camp comfort. The canoe trip will end at the town of Peace River on September 30 and the party entrain for Edmonton and the East.

Jim Boyce will again be head guide and outfitter for the pack trips and Donald Phillips' outfit again used on the river trip. Miss Hinman knows and has complete confidence in the head guides. The work of all camps is done by an efficient crew and experienced men handle the horses and canoes. The average size of the pack trip party is twelve. A day's trail ride averages fifteen miles and takes about five hours with a stop for a picnic lunch at noon. The trips are planned for girls and boys and men and women and Miss Hinman likes to have all represented in the party. The entire trip is suitable for anyone, of average energy and health, who loves a life in the open.

Prices are as follows:—July or August trip \$650; September trip \$695; July and August trips combined \$960; August and September trips combined \$1,110; July, August and September trips combined \$1,450. All prices cover everything from New York to New York. A deposit of \$25 holds a place and the balance is payable June 1. Miss Hinman is glad to furnish references and requires the same from prospective campers unknown to her.
